Report of the Trustees for the Period 30 January 2014 to 31 March 2015

The trustees who are also directors of the charity for the purposes of the Companies Act 2006, present their report with the financial statements of the charity for the period 30 January 2014 to 31 March 2015. The trustees have adopted the provisions of the Statement of Recommended Practice (SORP) 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities' issued in March 2005.

Commencement of activities

The Club commenced activities as a charitable company on the 1 April 2014.

Structure, governance and management

Governing document

Lasswade Gymnastics Club is a charitable company (charity registration number SC045040) limited by guarantee, as defined by the Companies Act 2006. The company is governed under its Articles of Association.

Recruitment and appointment of new trustees

No person may be appointed as a trustee unless that person has been recommended by the trustees as a result of a minuted board meeting.

Induction and training of new trustees

All trustees are made aware of the objectives of the charity on appointment and the necessary training is provided.

Risk management

The trustees have a duty to identify and review the risks to which the charity is exposed and to ensure appropriate controls are in place to provide reasonable assurance against fraud and error.

Objectives and activities

Objectives and aims

The main objects of the charity are to provide:

- Advancement of Education
- Advancement of Health, and the
- Advancement of Public Participation in Sport.

Achievement and performance

Charitable activities

The new Lasswade High School Centre is now more than 1 year old and this is our first year operating as a Limited Company with Charitable Status. It has taken the club some time to begin levelling out financially. Membership remained fairly static during this financial reporting period at an average of 115 participants.

The appointment of a Pathways Officer role In March 2015 will enable membership to grow substantially within the next financial year with a target of 200 members.

The club has had a successful year with our gymnasts performing successfully at competitions ranging from Local Floor and Vault level up to Scottish Championships with a number of our gymnasts also being selected to represent Scotland in National Finals. The addition of our Men's Artistic Section of the club has broadened the spectrum of disciplines we now offer.

Achievement and performance

Fundraising activities

A review has been carried out on our fee structure and there will be an increase applied to all members fees in April 2015 to meet the increased operating costs.

The club now employs 6 part time coaches, engages the services of 10 self employed coaches and has 4 volunteer coaches. Hall hire costs are projected to rise to £15k during the next financial year.

We intend to dedicate an increase budget of £2k towards coach development in the coming year to enable our coaches to meet the increasing level of our gymnasts and to enable development of new coaches to service the increased membership of the club. Much of this will be achieved through funding applications.

Opportunities were missed last year for the acquisition of funding and grants and this is an area the club would like to address during 2015/16. The club has an active fundraising and events team who run a range of small activities throughout the year.

The year has been a challenging one and making the transition from a club to a Limited Company with Charitable Status has posed significant change. The sad loss of one of our directors and founding member of the club, Gus Williamson, to cancer dealt the club a huge blow.

It has taken some time to restructure the club and coaching management to provide a good platform for the future. Our coaching team, Directors and Volunteers do an amazing job and we will continue to work hard to ensure the club is successful and meets the needs of all its members.

Financial review

Reserves policy

In line with good practice, Lasswade Gymnastics Club's financial policy remains to maintain reserves at a level which allows the company to operate from year to year. At 31 March 2015 our total funds stand at £5,971, of which £8,513 refers to restricted funds.

There is a small deficit on the unrestricted fund and the following steps have been taken to address this: fees have been increased; more gymnasts have been taken on; and cost savings have been made. This should bring the unrestricted fund back into a surplus in the near future.

Future developments

The club is currently expanding it's membership, and includes Women's Artistic, Men's Artistic and General Gymnastics.

The club, with assistance from Sport Scotland and Midlothian Council, has also employed a Pathways Development Officer (Jillian Givan), to ensure development of gymnasts around the Midlothian area, with a view to enlisting additional gymnasts to the club and increasing and sustaining membership for many years to come.

Statement of trustees responsibilities

The trustees (who are also the directors of Lasswade Gymnastics Club for the purposes of company law) are responsible for preparing the Report of the Trustees and the financial statements in accordance with applicable law and United Kingdom Accounting Standards (United Kingdom Generally Accepted Accounting Practice).

Company law requires the trustees to prepare financial statements for each financial year which give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the charitable company and of the incoming resources and application of resources, including the income and expenditure, of the charitable company for that period. In preparing those financial statements, the trustees are required to

- select suitable accounting policies and then apply them consistently;
- observe the methods and principles in the Charity SORP;
- make judgements and estimates that are reasonable and prudent;
- prepare the financial statements on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the charitable company will continue in business.

The trustees are responsible for keeping proper accounting records which disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the charitable company and to enable them to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Companies Act 2006. They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the charitable company and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

1. Accounting policies

Accounting convention

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention, and in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective April 2008), the Companies Act 2006 and the requirements of the Statement of Recommended Practice, Accounting and Reporting by Charities.

Incoming resources

All incoming resources are included on the Statement of Financial Activities when the charity is legally entitled to the income and the amount can be quantified with reasonable accuracy.

Resources expended

Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all cost related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources.

Stocks

Stocks are valued at the lower of cost and net realisable value, after making due allowance for obsolete and slow moving items.

Taxation

The charity is exempt from corporation tax on its charitable activities.

Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the trustees.

Restricted funds can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes.

Further explanation of the nature and purpose of each fund is included in the notes to the financial statements.

Going concern

The company has a deficiency of assets on its unrestricted funds. In response, plans have been drawn up to address this as detailed in the Financial Review on page 3. For this reason the accounts have been prepared on the Going Concern basis.
