Report of the Trustees for the Year Ended 31 March 2021

The trustees who are also directors of the charity for the purposes of the Companies Act 2006, present their report with the financial statements of the charity for the year ended 31 March 2021. The trustees have adopted the provisions of Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2019).

## Objectives and activities Objectives and aims

The main objects of the charity are to provide:

- Advancement of Education
- Advancement of Health, and the
- Advancement of Public Participation in Sport.

The aim of Lasswade Gymnastics Club ("the Club") is to provide a safe, effective and child friendly environment in which members can participate in competitive artistic gymnastic activities under the guidance of appropriately qualified coaches.

Our club offers a wide spectrum of classes across three main disciplines: Women's Artistic (WA), Men's Artistic (MA) and General Gymnastics. Our WA and MA classes all aim to develop individual gymnasts' potential to compete at a Regional/Club, National and Elite level and achieve their full competitive potential. Our General section is split into competitive Floor and Vault classes where gymnasts may compete in Scottish Level Competitions and recreational classes which are for fun and fitness.

#### **Development and Activities**

This financial year was one of the most challenging years in club history with the global Covid-19 Pandemic halting all face-to-face coaching activity for almost the full duration of the year. Our trustees and coaches worked quickly to reinvent our coaching provision online to enable us to continue to provide a reduced but critical online service to our members. While our online provision ensured that the majority of our membership was retained, our offering was greatly reduced and towards the end of the financial year membership numbers suffered dipping to 220, our lowest membership levels in over 5 years. Our aim is to increase this number as soon as a return to the Gym is permitted and return to pre-Covid Membership numbers in excess of 250. Our fee income was significantly affected by both our drop in membership and a revised fees policy during the pandemic which requested half fees where possible for our members for the provision of our online activities.

The club employed eleven part-time coaches, engaged the services of two self-employed coaches and seven volunteer helper/coaches during this accounting period. All coaching staff experienced reduced hours and periods of furlough during this challenging year, but we managed to retain all of our employed coaches and aim to ensure continued job security for the future.

There was no formal investment in coach development during this period as this was not possible but the development of our online activity and the need to work more closely brought significant personal growth and development for our coaches, trustee's and helpers.

There was a drop in income from general fundraising as this was not possible during the accounting period.

Our trustees remained static and played a significant role in ensuring our club adapted and continued to thrive during the significant and fast changing challenges of the year.

#### Achievement and performance

No competitive activities were possible during this year, so our coaching team created many innovative ways to continually engage and challenge our gymnasts both via competitive and individual goals and challenges.

#### Financial review

#### Financial position

With careful management of our resources and continued engagement from our membership to our greatly reduced programme, we managed to consolidate the Club's financial position this year. An overall surplus of £14,027 was achieved this year which was in line with the Club's overall aims of increased participation and providing a framework in which to be able to deliver performance gymnastics, while consolidating our financial position.

Reserves policy

In line with good practice, the Club's financial policy remains to maintain reserves at a level which allows the company to operate from year to year. At 31 March 2021 our total funds stand at £94,835. The directors consider that the minimum level of liquid reserves maintained should be equivalent to four months of key operating overhead expenditure. This equates to £68,525 and therefore the target was achieved. The directors will continue to work to maintain free reserves in line with the stated policy.

Future plans

The Club will aim to regenerate its membership to over 250 members by the end of 2021 with a retained emphasis on Women's Artistic, Men's Artistic and General Gymnastics. The development of Coaches remains a critical factor for the success of our club and the local community. As soon as coaching development activity can restart, we will ensure that our team receive the development needed and our young helpers will begin their UKCC qualifications and support the future of our club.

## Structure, governance and management

Governing document

Lasswade Gymnastics Club is a charitable company (charity registration number SC045040) limited by guarantee, as defined by the Companies Act 2006. The company is governed under its Articles of Association.

Recruitment and appointment of new trustees

No person may be appointed as a trustee unless that person has been recommended by the trustees, as a result of a minuted board meeting. There is a formal application process for proposed new trustees which enables us to assess an individual's key skills and experience. This will ensure our Board of Trustees has the correct mix of expertise to develop the Club for the future.

Induction and training of new trustees

All trustees are made aware of the objectives of the charity on appointment and the necessary training is provided.

Pay Policy

The trustees consider the Board of Directors, who are the Charity's trustees, the Coaching Team and the Pathways Officer comprise the key management personnel of the Club in charge of directing and controlling, running and operating the Club on a day to day basis. Trustees are not remunerated for their services as trustees. The pay of staff is reviewed annually and normally increased in line with inflation, taking into account affordability and any changes in duties and responsibilities.

## Structure, governance and management

Risk management

The Board of Directors have identified what they perceive as the key risks to the Club and have put in place measures to monitor and manage these risks appropriately. Key risks are considered to be the ongoing global COVID-19 Pandemic, the availability and retention of quality coaches, facility access and the safeguarding of children. Measures to manage these risks include the following:

COVID-19 Pandemic – the uncertainty created by the ongoing COVID-19 restrictions and uncertain future are an ongoing concern. Our trustees and coaching team continue to monitor and adhere to all restrictions. Our COVID Officer and Business Manager adapts our policies and practices on an almost daily basis to ensure our club can operate safely, within the restrictions and to ensure continued financial viability.

Coach availability and retention - developing new coaches from within the Club community and marketing the Club's achievements to attract new coaches; ensuring adequate development activities are provided and progression towards career aspirations; undertaking an annual review of the employment package to ensure the Club remains competitive. Facility access - long term lets with set rates agreed with the local authority, and a good working relationship maintained, including a shared focus on the increased participation in gymnastics and the provision of performance gymnastics in the

Safeguarding children - as all the Club's gymnasts are children, the Club adopts and strictly applies the best practices for safeguarding children as set out by the governing body.

This report has been prepared in accordance with the special provisions of Part 15 of the Companies Act 2006 relating to small companies.

I report on the accounts for the year ended 31 March 2021 set out on pages six to thirteen.

The charity's trustees are responsible for the preparation of the accounts in accordance with the terms of the Charities and Trustee Investment (Scotland) Act 2005 and the Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006. The charity's trustees consider that the audit requirement of Regulation 10(1)(a) to (c) of the Accounts Regulations does not apply. It is my responsibility to examine the accounts as required under Section 44(1)(c) of the Act and to state whether particular matters have come to my attention.

#### Basis of the independent examiner's report

My examination was carried out in accordance with Regulation 11 of the Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006. An examination includes a review of the accounting records kept by the charity and a comparison of the accounts presented with those records. It also includes consideration of any unusual items or disclosures in the accounts, and seeking explanations from you as trustees concerning any such matters. The procedures undertaken do not provide all the evidence that would be required in an audit, and consequently I do not express an audit opinion on the view given by the accounts.

#### 1. Statutory information

Lasswade Gymnastics Club is a private company, limited by guarantee with charitable status and registered in Scotland. In the event of the charity being wound up, the liability in respect of the guarantee is limited to £1 per member of the charity. The company's registration number and registered office address can be found on the Reference and Administrative Details page.

The presentation currency of the financial statements is the Pound Sterling (£).

#### 2. Accounting policies

Basis of preparing the financial statements

The financial statements of the charitable company, which is a public benefit entity under FRS 102, have been prepared in accordance with the Charities SORP (FRS 102) 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2019)', Financial Reporting Standard 102 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland' and the Companies Act 2006. The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

#### Income

All income is recognised once the charity has entitlement to the income, there is sufficient certainty of receipt and so it is probable that the income will be received, and the amount of income receivable can be measured reliably.

Fee income is recognised when the charity has entitlement after any performance conditions have been met, it is probable that the income will be received and the amount can be measured reliably. If entitlement is not met then these amounts are deferred.

Donations and grants are recognised when they have been communicated in writing with notification of both the amount and settlement date. In the event that a donation or grant is subject to conditions that require a level of performance before the charity is entitled to the funds, the income is deferred and not recognised until either those conditions are fully met, or the fulfilment of those conditions is wholly within the control of the charity and it is probable that those conditions will be fulfilled in the reporting period.

Expenditure

Expenditure is recognised as soon as there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the charity to that expenditure, it is probable that a transfer of economic benefits will be required in settlement and the amount of the obligation can be measured reliably.

All expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis. All expenses, including support costs and governance costs, are allocated or apportioned to the applicable expenditure headings in the statement of financial activities.

Government grants

Government grants are recognised at the fair value of the asset received or receivable when there is reasonable assurance that the company will comply with conditions attaching to them and the grants will be received using the accrual model.

#### Stocks

Stocks are valued at the lower of cost and net realisable value, after making due allowance for obsolete and slow moving items.

#### Taxation

The charity is exempt from corporation tax on its charitable activities.

**Fund accounting** 

Unrestricted funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the trustees.

Restricted funds can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes.

Further explanation of the nature and purpose of each fund is included in the notes to the financial statements.

#### Accounting policies - continued 2.

Pension costs and other post-retirement benefits

The charitable company operates a defined contribution pension scheme. Contributions payable to the charitable company's pension scheme are charged to the Statement of Financial Activities in the period to which they relate.

Going concern

The financial statements have been prepared on a going concern basis as the trustees believe that no material uncertainties exist. The trustees have considered the level of funds held and the expected level of income and expenditure for 12 months from authorising these financial statements. The budgeted income and expenditure is sufficient with the level of reserves for the charity to be able to continue as a going concern.

Debtors and creditors receivable / payable within one year

Debtors and creditors with no stated interest rate and receivable or payable within one year are recorded at transaction price. Any losses arising from impairment are recognised in expenditure.

Cash in bank and in hand

Cash at bank and cash in hand includes cash and short term highly liquid investments.
